The focus of this year's staff training in Investment Week has been on how we can support students with SEND. Staff have had additional training on how to adapt their teaching for individual student needs and this will be the focus of our teacher development training throughout this half term.

- To improve communication and collaboration between the school and parents.
- To introduce parents to one another as parenting a child with additional needs can be isolating and it may help to share experiences with one another.
- To explore areas that the school could better address to meet the needs of parents and families.
- To offer additional advice and guidance about common areas of interest.

Our next Parent Forum will be held from 2.30-4pm on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> December.

The focus for our next forum will be literacy support and we hope to share and discuss with you how we support students with additional needs relating to reading and writing.

#### **CHAT Room**

This half term we are excited to launch our Communication Hub Assistant Team (CHAT) Room.

This room is dedicated to supporting students with communication and interaction needs such as autism.

The room is run by Mrs Kim Tape, who is trained and experienced in supporting students with these needs.

It will be used to deliver interventions relating to language and social skills and for mentoring. It can also be used as a quiet workspace and the Sensory Room will also be accessed here.



#### Language and Literacy Testing

This term we are testing all Year 7 students' reading and language skills so we can offer appropriate interventions where needed.

# The Learning Support Room

We have now been running our Learning Support Room (LSR) for a term.

This room is led by the Head of Learning Support, Mrs Maria Eyre, who leads the Learning Support Team.

We have created this room as a quiet and supportive space which students can use to access time out, mentoring and other interventions. It allows us to focus support on students who are gradually returning to education after time off and on students who are struggling to access classroom learning for medical reasons.
